

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION ASSESSMENT AND COUNSELING TESTS

SAT or ACT

Self-reported SAT or ACT results are required on the admissions application. They could be considered for admission purposes if a student's GPA is below a 3.0. They are not considered for merit scholarship purposes. SAT or ACT scores may be used as an aid in course placement and for institutional research.

Prospective students are encouraged to take the SAT or ACT during their high school junior or senior year. Transfer students with fewer than 25 credit hours earned after high school are encouraged to have their SAT or ACT scores on file in the Admissions Office prior to registration.

Assessment and Evaluation After Enrollment

Students may be required to participate in testing and other programs necessary for placement, evaluation, and assessment purposes.
